<p>3. In trouble, need assistance</p>	<p>Wave signal flare (night end)</p>	 <p>A diver is shown from the chest up, floating in the water. The diver's right arm is raised, holding a flare that is emitting a long, dark, wavy trail of smoke or light.</p>
<p>4. In trouble, need assistance</p>	<p>Blue strobe on</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">STROBE LIGHT WITH BLUE LENS</p>  <p>A diver is shown from the chest up, wearing a diving mask and snorkel. A strobe light with a blue lens is attached to the diver's equipment, and it is emitting a bright, radiating light.</p>
<p>5. In trouble, need assistance. If on rope or hoist, set down immediately</p>	<p>Blue chemical light (activated)/blue strobe on</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">STROBE LIGHT WITH BLUE LENS/B CHEMICAL LIGHT (ACTIVATED)</p>  <p>A diver is shown from the chest up, wearing a diving mask and a vest. A blue chemical light is attached to the diver's equipment, and it is emitting a bright, radiating light.</p>
