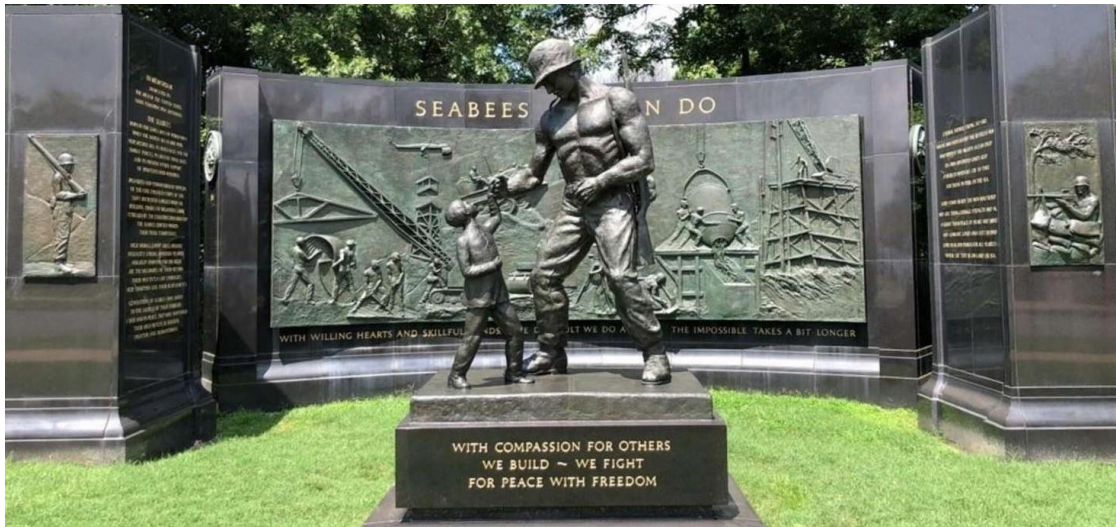

BRIEF HISTORY



Naval Construction Training Center (NCTC) Gulfport was originally commissioned on July 13, 1967, as Construction Training Unit, Gulfport. The unit's mission was to train direct procurement petty officers for the Naval Construction Force (NCF) during the Vietnam buildup.

In early 1968, the activity's mission was expanded to include the training of personnel assigned to battalions homeported in Gulfport as well as the majority of the Reserve NCF, in those skills necessary for the battalion to execute its construction mission.

With the deactivation of the Construction Battalion Center, Davisville, NCTC Gulfport and NCTC Port Hueneme were established as mirror training centers, each offering the same courses and training with approximately the same number of students.

In 1975, NCTC Gulfport became the first vocational technology school in the Navy to gain accreditation by the Council on Occupational Education.

The Interservice Training Review Organization (ITRO) was later created to reduce DoD costs by consolidating and collocating initial entry courses. In 1995, NCTC Gulfport was designated host activity for both the Builder and Steelworker "A" schools and training site for Army, Navy, and Air Force students. Under ITRO, detachments were established at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas and Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, to train Seabee Construction electricians, utilitiesmen, equipment operators and engineering aides, under the lead of the Air Force and Army respectively.

In 2003, as a part of the Navy's Revolution in Training, NCTC Gulfport became an Echelon V command reporting to the Center for Seabees and Facilities Engineering (CSFE) in Port Hueneme, CA. In addition, NCTC Gulfport became a Training Support Department (TSD) for the realigned CSFE detachments Fort Leonard Wood and Sheppard.

Today, NCTC trains and delivers over 5,400 Sailors, Airmen, and Army Soldiers every year, as joint service construction professionals that enhance warfighting lethality and leadership capabilities in expeditionary and shore-based environments.

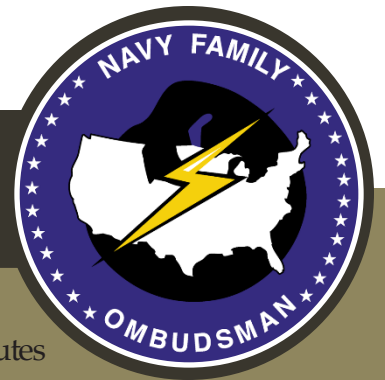

NCTC's homeport is in Gulfport, MS at NCBC Gulfport. It is located on the Mississippi Gulf Coast, 74 miles west of Mobile, Alabama, and 78 miles east of New Orleans, Louisiana. The base itself is located south of Interstate 10 (just south of 28th Street) and west of Route 49. The Local airport in the area is the Gulfport/Biloxi International Airport. POV Minimum Requirements On Base

- Posses a valid state driver's license supported by an appropriate Military ID
- Posses a certificate of valid state registration
- Posses valid proof of insurance with minimum required level of coverage

Registration

- Mississippi does not offer any vehicle registration exemptions or waivers for most resident military members residing in the state.
- Before you register your vehicle make sure you bring:
 - Copy of your official orders that reflect your command in Mississippi
 - Latest Leave and Earning statement
 - Latest and correct vehicle registration
 - Two forms of Photo I. D.

Military Residents Stationed In State

- If you're an out-of-state military member stationed in Mississippi, you do not have to obtain Mississippi license plates. This also applies to your dependents. If you decide to register your vehicle in Mississippi, you will be exempt from paying ad valorem taxes. To qualify:
- Provide an additional "Letter of Domicile" from your military base's legal office.

Some Mississippi Laws

- The driver and passengers must wear safety belts.
- An approved child or infant safety seat must be used.
- Use of headphones and cell phones are prohibited while operating any motor vehicle on base.
- The use and/or display of RADAR detectors on base are prohibited.
- Motorcycle, moped, or scooter operators must show proof of completion of a certified Motorcycle Operator Safety course. All required personal protective equipment must be worn.

COASTAL WEATHER

- During severe weather, the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Association broadcasts weather reports from Gulfport and Biloxi through local weather and news stations. The hottest month on the Mississippi coast is July, with an average maximum temperature of 98.7 degrees. The coolest month is February, with an average low of 49.3 degrees. Relative humidity ranges from an average of 52% in May to a maximum of 96% in July.
- Tropical hurricane season occurs along the Gulf Coast during the months of June through November, with greatest frequency during August, September, and October. Less serious, but much more frequent, are thunderstorms accompanied by high velocity winds, hail and lightning. About 75% of all hurricanes that have struck the Mississippi Gulf Coast since the turn of century have been Category 3 or higher. Advance preparation on personal and family disaster plans along with a disaster survival kit will minimize the effects of such severe weather conditions.

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS KIT

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation.
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food.
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both.
- Flashlight and extra batteries. First aid kit.
- Whistle to signal for help.
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter in place.
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation.
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities. Manual can opener for food.
- Local maps.
- Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger.
