**IMPORTANT: CONTACT A SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE COORDINATOR (SARC) OR SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION AND RESPONSE VICTIM ADVOCATE (SAPR VA) FOR CONFIDENTIAL ASSISTANCE OR FOR MORE INFORMATION ABOUT REPORTING OPTIONS**

## Department of Defense Restricted Report

- Confidential
- Access to SARC and VA
- Access to Military Medical and Counseling Services\*

## Department of Defense Unrestricted Report

- Sensitive/Need-to-know
- Access to SARC and VA
- Access to Military Medical and Counseling Services\*
- Law enforcement investigation
- Command Involvement

## Eligibility

### Active Duty

Eligible to file a Restricted Report or Unrestricted Report

Full SAPR support services from a SARC and a SAPR victim advocate

### Reservists

Eligible to file a Restricted Report or Unrestricted Report

When sexually assaulted while performing active service and inactive duty training, have full SAPR support services from a SARC and a SAPR victim advocate

When sexually assaulted prior to entering service or while not performing active service or inactive training (civilian status), have immediate crisis SAPR support services from a SARC and SAPR victim advocate and connected to appropriate resources

### Military Dependents

Who are:

- 18+ years old
- Eligible for treatment in the military healthcare system
- At installations CONUS and OCONUS
- Victims of sexual assault perpetrated by someone other than a spouse or intimate partner

Eligible to file a Restricted Report or Unrestricted Report

Full SAPR support services from a SARC and a SAPR victim advocate

*(The Family Advocacy Program covers adult military dependent sexual assault victims who are assaulted by a spouse or intimate partner, and military dependent sexual assault victims who are 17 years old and younger.)*

### Civilians eligible for treatment in the military healthcare system

(E.g. dependents, retirees, civilians stationed or performing duties OCONUS)

Eligible to file an Unrestricted Report

Immediate crisis SAPR support services from a SARC and SAPR victim advocate and connected to appropriate resources

Civilian Employee Assistance Program (CEAP)

### All Other Civilians

Follow civilian reporting options

Immediate crisis SAPR support services from a SARC and SAPR victim advocate and connected to appropriate resources

Civilian Employee Assistance Program (CEAP)

\* In California and some other states, medical providers are required to report sexual assault to law enforcement and cannot offer a restricted report.
