

SECOND CLASS DIVER

Duration: 18 weeks - Offered 6 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course provides training in surface supplied air and SCUBA diving procedures to depths of 190 ft. Instruction includes diving physics and medicine; SCUBA diving and underwater searching; surface supplied air diving and equipment operations and procedures; underwater cutting and welding operations; basic demolition operations; underwater ship repair and salvage operations; closed circuit diving operations.

ELIGIBILITY: Enlisted ratings.

FIRST CLASS DIVER

Duration: 13 weeks - Offered 6 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course is designed to provide qualified divers with instruction and training in surface supplied air, mixed gas, SCUBA diving techniques, inspection, search, salvage and underwater procedures to safely and effectively perform as a diving supervisor to depths of 300 ft.

ELIGIBILITY: Enlisted Ratings with completion of Second Class Diver (MASL P179606) or International Diver Course (MASL P179003).

DIVER EXPLOSIVE ORDNANCE DISPOSAL

MASL: P179190 CIN: A-431-0083 ECL: 80
Duration: 8 weeks - Offered 8 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course provides training necessary to safely perform as a dive team member for SCUBA and closed circuit diving operations. Instruction includes diving physics and medicine, SCUBA operations, and closed circuit diving operations. This course does not provide EOD-oriented technical, tactical, or operational training.

ELIBILITY: Officer and Enlisted ratings.

JOINT DIVING OFFICER

MASL: P179605 CIN: A-4N-0200 ECL: 80
Duration: 18 weeks - Offered 3 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course provides training for officers to perform as a diver, dive team member, diving supervisor, and Diving Officer to depths of 190 ft. Instruction includes diving physics and medicine; SCUBA operations; surface supplied air diving operations; diving supervisor procedures; underwater cutting and welding operations; underwater ship repair and salvage operations; hydrographic survey, side scan sonar, and remotely operated vehicle operations; swift water diving operations.

ELIGIBILITY: Officers.

MARINE ENGINEERING STRAND

MASL: P122176 CIN: A-433-0044 ECL: 80
Duration: 6 weeks - Offered 1 time per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course provides additional training that expands upon core competencies and advanced marine engineering training. Includes instruction in dive supervision, demolition operations, facility inspections, and small boat operations.

ELIGIBILITY: Officers with completion of Joint Diving Officer (MASL P179605).

UNDERWATER CONSTRUCTION TECHNICIAN

BASIC

Duration: 24 weeks - Offered 2 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course provides training necessary to safely and effectively accomplish the mission of the Underwater Construction Teams (UCTs) during peacetime and contingency operations.

ELIGIBILITY: Enlisted ratings.

MEDICAL DEPARTMENT DIVING OFFICER

MASL: P175503 CIN: A-6A-0010 ECL: 80
Duration: 9 weeks - Offered 2 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course provides medical officers with training in diving and dive medicine. Instruction includes hyperbaric medicine and physiology, SCUBA operations, surface supplied air diving and equipment, and familiarization of surface supplied mixed gas and closed circuit diving operations. A critical component of the course is daily physical training involving calisthenics, running, and swimming.

ELIGIBILITY: Medical Officer/Physician Assistants.

RECOGNITION AND TREATMENT OF DIVING CASUALTIES

Duration: 2 weeks - Offered 2 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical

Course provides medical officers with the training to perform as a medical advisor for hyperbaric treatments and to evaluate divers and diver candidates prior to diving. Instruction includes identifying diving diseases and injuries, initiating appropriate treatment, performing appropriate diving medical examinations, and performing as an inside tender for hyperbaric chamber operations.

ELIGIBILITY: Medical Officer/Physician Assistants.

AMPHIBIOUS RECONNAISSANCE CORPSMAN

MASL: P175520 CIN: A-431-0076 ECL: 80
Duration: 6 weeks - Offered 6 times per year
Prerequisite: Dive medical physical with special duty abstract

Course provides training in identifying diving casualties and performing medical functions as a recompression inside tender. Includes instruction in diagnosis and treatment of diving disorders and recompression chamber operations and emergency procedures.

ELIGIBILITY: Enlisted diving medical personnel.
