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Departmental Updates

OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT

The Operations Department had another busy quarter on its hands. In the CIC Skills Division, OS J School, led by OSC Paredes and OS1 Willie Martin, graduated a total of 17 students whereas RADAR Navigation (RADNAV) led by OS1 Willie Martin saw USS SAMPSON (DDG 102), USS CHANCELLORVILLE (CG-62), USS McCLUSKY (FFG 41), and USS PEARL HARBOR (LSD 52), steam through for either certification or training, graduating a total of 65 students. In addition, Search and Rescue (SAR), led by OS1 Gilfred Caiga, provided 36 students with the level of knowledge necessary to perform SAR duties during SAR missions and Surface Warfare Tactical Applications Course (SWTAC), led by OS1 Steven Lowe, graduated 22 students, returning them to their commands with requisite knowledge on Anti Submarine Warfare (ASW), Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Intelligence (C4I), Surface Warfare, Air Warfare, Amphibious Warfare, and Mine Warfare. Computer Aided Dead Reckoning Tracer (CADRT) held a special convening, led by OS1 Steven Lowe and OS2 Stephen Young, graduating 6 students from USS CHAFFE (DDG 90).

Tactical Data Coordinator (TDC) led by OSC Jerry Green, OS1 Marvel Gillespie and OS1 Charles Caskey, provided 44 students with the knowledge necessary to manage and operate various types of Data Links, while Interface Control Officer (ICO) led by LTJG Flournoy and OSC Jerry Green, provided 13 students the experience level knowledge required to manage and execute tactical data link coordination within multi-national operations. Lastly, for CIC Skills, Ships Self Defense System (SSDS) Basic, Advanced and Watch Officer, led by OS1 Billy Giakoumakis and OS2 Lapaul Wordlaw, provided 41 students with the skills necessary to operate an advanced combat system.

Apart from the large contingent of graduates from the CIC Skills courses, other divisions also capped off the calendar year with more Fleet-ready Sailors. In ASW Tactics Division, 9 students from the Surface Ship ASW Specialist (SSAS), led by STGCS Duran, STGCS Palmer, and STGC Maresh, and 21 students from the Anti-Submarine Warfare Evaluator (ASWE), led by STGC Schmeck, STG1 Cerrillo, and STG1 Person, graduated with the most updated knowledge on anti-submarine warfare tactics. In the AIC Division, 12 students from AIC Basic, OSC Miranda and OSC Paragas, 5 AIC Requalification, led by OSCM Terry and OSC Gomes, and 7 students from AIC Proficiency and Maintenance, led by OSC McLain and OSC Paragas, graduated, whereas 8 ASTAC Basic students, led by OS1 Topham and OS2 Sumpter, 3 SCAC students, led by OS1 Pen and OS1 Swales, and 8 ADC students, led by OS1 Pen and OS1 Imler, graduated from the ASTAC Division.

We also had numerous personnel who received recognition for their hard work. OSC Henry received the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal for his End-of-Tour Award whereas OSC Green, OSC Paredes, OSC Trevino, OS1 Lowe, OS1 Swales, OS1 Williams received the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal. In addition, we also had 3 Sailors advance to Petty Officer First Class: OS1 Carter, OS1 Imler, and OS1 Weber. Apart that, we also like to recognize OS2 Derflinger who was selected Junior Instructor of the Quarter for Third Quarter for Calendar Year 2012.

LEARNING STANDARDS OFFICE

Many of you may be familiar with the Master Training Specialist (MTS) program. For those of you who are not, the MTS Program is designed to develop and qualify those individuals who possess advanced knowledge, skills and abilities that will enhance the delivery of quality education and training in the navy. Individuals who are designated MTS are expected to take a leadership role and mentor, instruct, and evaluate instructors and curricula products. A qualified MTS can certify instructor trainees, participate in instructor evaluations, provide in-service training and contribute to the curriculum development process. FLEASWTRACEN has always encouraged personnel to obtain the MTS designation at least one year prior to their Planned Rotation Date (PRD). The MTS bullet is an important consideration for promotion boards

NETC has once again updated the requirements associated with the MTS program. In September 2012 the NAVEDTRA 43100-7 MTS PQS took effect. The objective of the MTS PQS is to standardize and facilitate the qualifications. The prerequisites contained in Section 301 must be completed prior to MTS PQS designation participation. Individual waiver requests to prerequisites and to participate in the MTS PQS may be submitted to the MTS PQS Model Manager. Further details are contained within NETCINST 1500.2 (series).

This has been a year of significant personnel changes in the LSO. Mr. Gunst retired on 31 Dec 2011 after 42 years of government service, leaving a GS-1750-12 vacancy. Mr. Bob Myers was promoted to fill the GS-1750-12 position in June 2012. His promotion created a GS-1712-11 vacancy. Due to budget constraints, the GS-11 position was put on hold. Fortunately, FLEASWTRACEN recently received permission to fill the vacant GS-1712-11, and Mr. Pat Lekovish has been promoted into this position. It is a pleasure to be able to promote from within and reward a very deserving candidate.



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


To join:

1. Go to the browser address listed next to the date you want to attend. It will take you to a registration website where you'll be asked for a few pieces of information.
2. You will receive a confirmation email from WEBINAR providing the Internet browser address for the session as well as the telephone number to dial.

To attend session:

1. Insert the website address for the session into your browser window. It will scroll and a box will come up on your screen.
2. Click "Download GoToMeeting".
3. Click "run".
4. A bar will appear in the middle of the page as it downloads.
5. If you arrive before the facilitator, a window will let you know. Do not exit the window. Just wait for the meeting to start.
6. Once completed, the computer will ask you to enter: Name & email address.
7. "Waiting to View Screen" will appear. You are connected.
8. Dial in on your phone by calling: **1-800-791-2345 Code: 40560**
